If you are planning shoreline work (seawall, glacial stone, rip-rap, etc.), a new or renovated pier, a waterfront deck or any work at or near the shoreline of your property you may be required to complete a construction application and obtain County and/or US Army Corp of Engineers permits. For details on the specific construction regulations and the approvals required for your project, pick-up a copy of the revised "LDPOA Construction Regulations and Application" from the info box outside of the Community building or download from the Community web-site [www.lakedalecarlia.org](http://www.lakedalecarlia.org). Failure to obtain all of the necessary approvals and permits BEFORE commencing work on your project will result in fines from the LDPOA, County and USACE.



## LDPOA Membership Meeting Minutes February 2012

The meeting of the Lake Dalecarlia Property Owners Association was held on February 20, 2012. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by President Martha Coakley. The board members: Tim Hutfilz, Geane Anderson (absent), Bridget Gruzdis, Mark Torphy, Kelly Steuer, Jim Jacobsen, Don Stone, Judy Wolff, Laurie Lau, Jack Hawkins, Tove Roe, and Olga Claesson, 14 general members, and 2 guests were in attendance. The board welcomed newly elected Vice President Tim Hutfilz. On a Motion made by Don Stone and seconded by Olga Claussen, the Minutes of the January 16, 2012 meeting were accepted. Approved. Treasurer report indicated January 2012 Total Income \$56,183.46; Total Expenses \$7,515.65; Total Net Income \$48,667.81; Balance: \$136,164.32. The board thanked Meridith Wells for the invaluable assistance she has given during Geane's absence. On a Motion made by Tim Hutfilz and seconded by Tove Roe, the treasurer's report was accepted for audit. Approved. Bridget Gruzdis reported there are several hall rentals coming up along with some inquiries not yet reserved.

Ginny Feyes reported there are 427 Paid Assessments out of 558 Homeowners, 131 pending. Liens 23, Bankruptcies 2, and Foreclosures 11. Vivian reports that all newsletter articles are due by Monday, February 27, 2012, 8:30 pm and Newsletter assembly is Wednesday, March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2012 at 8:00 AM at the POA building. The Board announced that Ricardo's Restaurant has recently changed ownership. Jim Webb took over the restaurant around the end of January. Welcome to the community, Jim! The board is grateful to Rich and Carolyn Hassberg for building out such a terrific restaurant, serving delicious food and giving our community a great place to come together. Martha updated the Board relative to status of the dam renovation. Martha attended a pre-bid meeting at the county on Friday, February 3<sup>rd</sup> and also on Wednesday February 15<sup>th</sup> when the bids were accepted by the Commissioners. At the present time the attorney for the Commissioners is reviewing all submitted bids; they will then be reviewed by the engineers, and the grant administrator to make sure they follow grant guidelines. Final bid approval will be given by the Commissioners at their March meeting. Don Stone reported they shored up a tree-damaged outlot pier. It will either require more repairs or be removed. It is not useable at this time. Jack Hawkins suggested we salvage

what we can to use in the repair of other outlot piers. Options will be looked into as to where the salvaged dock materials can be stored. Thank you Don and Jack for all your hard work. Stan Lee and Martha addressed the ongoing issue regarding volunteers for the boat and safety patrol. This is one of the most important committees in the POA. The only way we can have safe boating is to have volunteers come forward. It was suggested our Section Reps be involved in promoting volunteers. If you feel you can devote some time to see that our boating season remain safe, please contact your section rep. Volunteers offering to participate would result in fewer hours required of each volunteer. In some cases just by merely wearing one of the bright green safety patrol shirts as you are out on your personal watercraft will be a reminder to other boaters to observe the boating regulations.

She also reported that the new house on W. Lakeview Drive is in the process of being connected. SECRETARIAL REPORT (Nicole Walkowiak, District Manager) January 9, 2012 Meeting Motion by Virginia Feyes to accept the Minutes of the January 9, 2012 Meeting Second by Judith Wolff. Questions or corrections? No. Motion Approved. FINANCIAL REPORTS January financial reports Motion by Virginia Feyes to approve the financial reports for January 2012. Second by Stanley Lee. Questions or corrections? Yes. Herb Steuer questioned the cash at the end of 2011. Nicole Walkowiak stated that this had been discussed before and would get an answer from Tim Sendak regarding the excess. Herb Steuer also questioned that we have already exceeded our engineering budget for the year on engineering. Nicole Walkowiak stated that was a 6 month bill from Haas & Associates. And again stated that the individual line item budget can be changed in house as long as the total budget stays the same. Herb Steuer also asked about the line item expenses for the gravity system. Nicole Walkowiak stated that this is not a monthly billing, but is billed periodically. Motion by Stanley Lee to approve all claims presented to be paid in February 2012 Second by Judith Wolff. Questions or corrections? No Motion Approved. OLD BUSINESS POA dam project – impact to LDRWD Peggy Jo Stamper stated that they received an agreement within the past week from the POA and were working with POA attorneys to reach an acceptable agreement for both parties. Peggy Jo Stamper also stated that there were some engineering concerns that needed to be cleared up prior to any agreement. She stated that Tim Sendak recommends that the board takes no action regarding the agreement. Employee Raises/Bonus The board again discussed the possibility of 2012 raises. Herb Steuer and Judith Wolff asked for current comparables for other small sewer districts as the numbers that Stanley Lee presented were from 2008 and did not indicate the size of the district. Nicole Walkowiak also stated that employee reviews should be ready for the next meeting, in executive session. Motion by Virginia Feyes to table until after employee reviews. Seconded by Stanley Lee. Questions or corrections? No. Motion Approved. Secretarial Note: Nicole Walkowiak contacted the IRSDA and they sent out a survey to regional sewer districts in the state of Indiana via email. Once they have received the responses, they will compile a report to send out for comparison. This survey will only be for sewer districts (not towns or cities) and will indicate all the information needed for appropriate comparisons. NEW BUSINESS Tap Request – Lot 69 Fairways Nicole Walkowiak presented a tap request for Lot 69 in the Fairways. Motion by Stanley Lee to approve tap request. Seconded by Judith Wolff. Questions or corrections? Martha Coakley stated that she heard a trailer would be placed on the lot and told Virginia Feyes to check with the Fairways Property owners association. Nicole Walkowiak stated that she had been in direct contact with the property owner and they were NOT putting a trailer on the lot, that it would be a 2 story single family home. Virginia Feyes also

Nicole Walkowiak stated that she had been in direct contact with the property owner and they were NOT putting a trailer on the lot, that it would be a 2 story single family home. Virginia Feyes also agreed that she had been in contact with the property owner and this was not a concern. Rainflow data report Nicole Walkowiak reported that she had been sending the information to Jim Maurer. He provided a letter that Nicole Walkowiak read. (Letter attached to minutes). Based on the engineer's letter, Nicole Walkowiak will contact all people on the waiting list to apply for tap permits. Maintenance Truck Nicole Walkowiak stated that the white maintenance truck backfired the other day and blew a hole in the muffler and the tailpipe. Nicole stated that she called USA muffler and the want \$650 to replace the exhaust system. Nicole's concern is putting this much money into a truck that is falling apart. Some of the problems include the floor boards are rotting out and water splashed into the cab when you drive thru a puddle, the driver door does not always shut properly and the seat belts do not always engage. Nicole asked the board if she could begin to look for a new truck of similar style. Motion by Virginia Feyes to have Nicole research maintenance trucks up to \$10,000 and to make any temporary repairs to the exhaust systems. Seconded by Judith Wolff. Questions or corrections? No. Motion Approved. FW Treatment Plant Nicole Walkowiak reported that all work at the treatment plant had been completed. She explained that during the construction there were 15 drop pipes made out of aluminum and had stainless steel diffusers attached to them. These aluminum and stainless steel are dissimilar metals and should have had a plastic bushing installed between them. There was an error from Siemens and that bushing was eliminated from our drawings. This caused the aluminum to corrode and deteriorate. Siemens covered the repairs under their warranty and had Gerig-Ottenweller come out and replace all 15 drop pipes with stainless steel drop pipes at no cost to the District. All work has been completed and Jim Maurer sent a suggested letter to Gerig-Ottenweller (Letter attached to minutes) Motion by Stanley Lee to send suggested letter to Gerig-Ottenweller. Seconded by Virginia Feyes. Questions or corrections? No. Motion Approved.

## OPEN DISCUSSION/PUBLIC COMMENT

Martha Coakley asked why the engineering concerns had not been brought up prior to today. Peggy Jo Stamper stated that the agreement was just received last week from the POA attorney and this would be included in the agreement.

ADJOURN Motion to adjourn by Virginia Feyes at 8:30 Second by Judith Wolff Next regular scheduled monthly meeting is Monday, March 12, 2012 at 7:30 pm at the Lake Dalecarlia Property Owner's Association building.
